

2020-2021 brought great uncertainty and fear to our local small businesses, community and non-profits. BESThq was not above the challenges of the pandemic – we felt it too. Because of the COVID squeeze, we could not effectively publish a 2020 Benefit Report. We could not accomplish everything we set out to do, but the BESThq team knew there was only one way to go about business through the COVID pandemic; get in the trenches with our partners and work together to build each other up, mitigate challenges, find solutions, and move forward toward success.

A few key highlights from 2020-2021 (combined report) include our Business Expo West held in April 2020, just after the pandemic hit. Being able to virtually deliver on this event brought community hope for a brighter, stronger tomorrow. Following this event, our networking events continued in the virtual space, including our Leadership Seminar and Business Expo West 2021, while also mentoring and supporting other partners and community along the way.

Our STEAM Pathways and Minecraft events continued to flourish and experienced a substantial increase in participation from kids in our community interested in expanding their knowledge in science, technology, engineering, academics, and math. We maintained monthly STEAM Pathway events throughout the pandemic to offer a productive and innovative learning outlet for our youth. After moving our office to Tektroniks, and donating a great deal of items, we were able to set up a new STEAM Pathways center at BESThq's new home. Additionally, via the STEAM Pathways vehicle, we were able to do a "We Welcome" event, dedicated two STEAM Minecraft nights for JoyRX and Children's Cancer Center, and threw a Drone and Pizza night event.

With all the negative effects and isolation COVID brought about, we were inspired to think outside the box and find ways to connect in person, especially with our youth, who experienced such vulnerability throughout the pandemic.



STEAM Minecraft Night—BESThq's Plan Center team created STEAM Minecraft night in 2016, now a free, monthly reoccurring event, which brings together k-12 students and their families, as well as engineer professionals. BESThq STEAM Minecraft went on the road this summer to three locations in Washington. We continued to expand sponsor and partner relationships in 2021 with Itron, Gonzaga University, Emerio Design, the Bethany Public House, and Pietrok Engineering and Resources.



PDX Community Resource Network—BESThq helped launch and lift up this much needed Community Partnering Initiative. The Portland Metro Community Resource Network (PDX CRN) is a community engagement platform that focuses on firming up safety nets and expanding opportunities. The CRN aligns services, connects resources to fill unmet needs for community members, and accelerates impact by utilizing private sector innovation, leveraging public sector resources and mobilizing social service networks.



Looking in the Rearview - Moving Forward

2020 and 2021 presented great challenges and obstacles for BESThq and our business community.
